In the creative writing workshop, participants are invited to write about their understanding of burnout, overload, and resilience in the context of mental health and wellbeing. This may relate to a range of factors, including the workplace, caring responsibilities, life stage, etc. Guidance will be given to create drafts of new stories, life writing and poems. Through using imaginations, experiences, observations, research, conversations, and emotions we will build a body of work. \**There is no requirement to have done any creative writing before*.

After the workshop participants will be invited to submit drafts of writing with a focus on health and illness, and any relevant ideas/research links to the editors of a special edition of <u>Riptide Journal</u>. This anthology will be published as part of the legacy of <u>Reading Bodies</u> <u>Project</u>. Details about this publication will be discussed further in the workshop.

Contributors to the published anthology will liaise with the editors and have options to: \*Attribute their name or pseudonym to an individual piece.

\*Or their writing can be woven into a collaborative piece which will be attributed to the larger group.

## Preparation for the workshop:

Bring pens and paper – spare materials will be provided on the day too.
